# The 3rd Lands Housing & Urban Development Joint Sector Review Resolutions

THEME: "Industrialisation and job creation through planned land use and tenure security"



#### Land Sub-sector

- 1. Review and increase budget allocation for the sector to facilitate execution of the Sector mandate:
- 2. Prioritize staff recruitment and retooling for the sector in particular the newly established 21 Ministry Zonal Offices (MZOs)
- 3. Develop / put in place all the required and lacking policies, laws, standards and guidelines to enhance sector performance;
- 4. Support the Land Management Institutions (DLBs, ALCs and PPCs) with conditional grants/ funding to facilitate implementation of the accorded mandates: 5. Operationalization of the Land Fund;
- 6. Increase sector awareness creation, popularization and dissemination of the programs, services and interventions at all levels;
- 7. Share progress with key stakeholders for the ongoing and upcoming Bills/Policies/Guidelines;
- 8. Develop a National Customary Land Registry;
- 9. Improve and strengthen the coordination with other Government MDAs and other stakeholders in implementation of Government Programs;
- 10. Survey and register all Public and Government land;
- 11. Develop a comprehensive Government land inventory:
- 12. Develop a special concept for funding the operations of the 21 MZOs:
- 13. Enhance the land registration processes in order to increase the percentage of land registered in the country which is currently at 20%;
- 14.Retool the offices of the CGV and Surveying and Mapping Department;

- 15. Devise mechanisms and methods to effectively deal with land disputes/land evictions:
- 16. Engage cultural and religious institutions in all land related matters; and
- 17. Fast track the enactment of the Uganda Land Commission Bill.

#### Housing Sub-sector

- 1. Promote housing development to address the increasing housing backlog;
- 2. Implement the existing policies and legislation including the National Housing Policy and Condominium law, among others;
- 3. Develop other legislation such as the Housing Bill;
- 4. Take a lead in housing development i.e. undertake social housing programs;
- 5. Acquire land for housing development;
- 6. Provide incentives, subsidies, and guarantees for private sector developers;
- 7. Recruit Housing Officers at MZOs: and
- 8. Provide infrastructure services in human settlements.

### Physical Planning & Urban Development Sub-sector

- 1. Support the actualization of the city status of the recently declared new cities (develop a strategy):
- 2. Devise mechanisms and methods to enhance the implementation of the National Physical Development Plan and other Physical Development Plans;
- 3. Create of satellite cities to decongest Kampala City: and

#### 4. Plan with the people but not for the people.

#### **Cross-cutting Resolutions**

- 1. Review and increase budget allocation for the sector to facilitate execution of its mandate;
- 2. Involve the Ministry in the process of NDP III planning;
- 3. Strengthen and enhance relationships with Local Governments and other related MDAs including Ministry of Water and Environment and NEMA among others:
- 4. Carry out Ministry capacity building and development;
- 5. Advocate and lobby for a revenue retainer; and
- 6. Ensure balanced allocation of the sector funding to all sub-sectors
